

ARCHEOTECTURE 2023

Archeotecture is a term which has been created by Andrzej Kadłuczka (an architect and monument conservator) and Klaudia Stala (an archaeologist and medieval architecture expert), both professors at the Institute of History of Architecture and Monument Preservation.

Archeotecture means: all architectural relics discovered during excavations and all archaeological sites which are part of historical surrounding and natural landscape and which have been arranged, designed or organized by architects, preservation designers and architecture historians in order to:

- protect an archaeological heritage
- create a symbolic bridge between past and contemporary times,
- communicate local communities with their heritage,
- educate people,
- give a new life to relics and possibility to exist according to universal Vitruvius' theory as *ulilitas, firmitas, venustas*

During the course students:

- work on chosen archaeological sites
- visit chosen sites
- deliver conceptual projects as their final works
- give public presentations of their projects
- prepare public exhibition in our Department's gallery
- take part in a one day tour trip
- gain lots of experience.

This year, all selected archaeological sites are the examples of prehistoric and medieval strongholds located in picturesque natural landscape

After the exhibition in Art Gallery in Kanonicza street each student may receive a certificate of being of co-author of presented works and participating in collective exposition
